Your student's Imagine Purpose journey introduces them to new friends, the Sparks. They're cute and clever personifications of five key emotions: happiness (Chow), sadness (Izzy), anger (Pepper), peace (Koko), love (Fizz), and fear (Boa). Try these conversation starters to hear what your student's Spark buddies are up to:

- Which Spark are you learning about in school?
- Which Spark space are you in right now? (when experiencing a big emotion)
- What do you think each Spark would say right now? (in response to an event)

Make learning happen at home

At-home support and encouragement are valuable. If your student wants to explore Imagine Purpose beyond the classroom, try these tips to help them connect.

- Choose a comfortable, distraction-free space as a work area for your student
- Create a plan, such as 'focus time' and 'break time,' to help them connect and succeed
- Make sure your student has Wi-Fi and a charged device, such as a laptop, tablet, or smartphone
- Show interest in what your student is reading about with questions like, "What did your learning focus on today?" or "What questions do you have about the lesson?"
