ZOOM

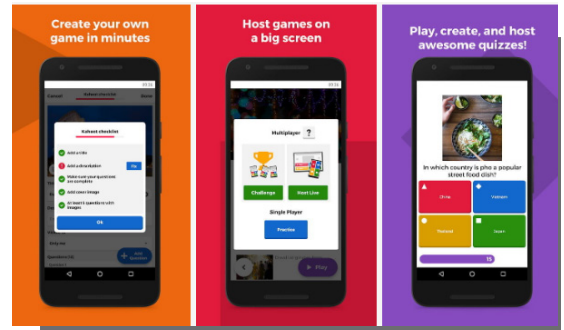
With Zoom, a free or paid platform, teachers can host meetings with hundreds of attendees, share files with students, share lesson plans, give instruction, illustrate using a whiteboard, create breakout rooms for student to student learning and so much more. The free version of the app supports unlimited 1-to-1 meetings and a 40-minute time limit on group meetings. The base paid version though starting at just \$15 a month, offers meetings with up to 100 participants running up to 24 hours long.

Maybe it is time for a brain break.... try Kahoots

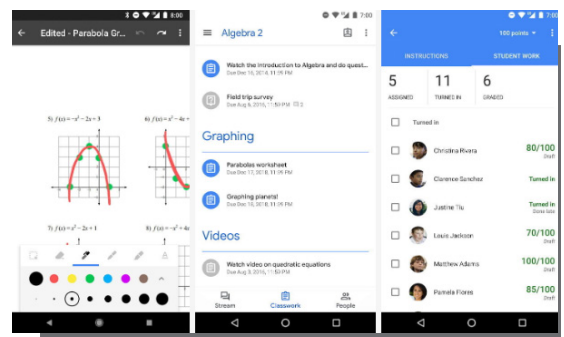
